Gender and age are known to have a significant influence on the frequency and severity of road accidents.

However, social, territorial, economic and cultural inequalities, also significantly influence the risk of being involved in a road accident.

In fact, various studies and surveys have been carried out in several countries, all of them concluding that, those kinds of inequalities have a decisive influence on road accidents, both in their frequency and their severity.

As road safety and sustainable mobility are everyone's rights, what should we do to reduce and tend to eliminate those differences in road risk?

How to promote social engagement despite inequalities? Who's responsible for it?

What are the most effective strategies? How can we promote safe behaviors despite inequalities? Integration of road safety education and training as a citizen? Which media are best suited to each case? Can enforcement and the type of punishment for various types of offenses play a positive role? What role can traffic organization and the type of road infra structure provided play?
